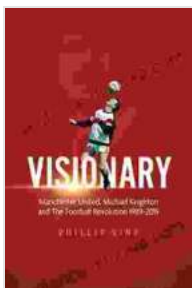


# Manchester United: Michael Knighton and the Football Revolution 1989-2024

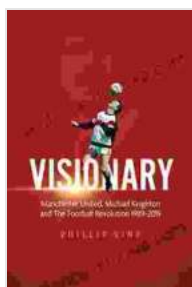
