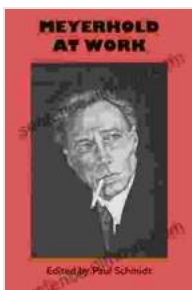

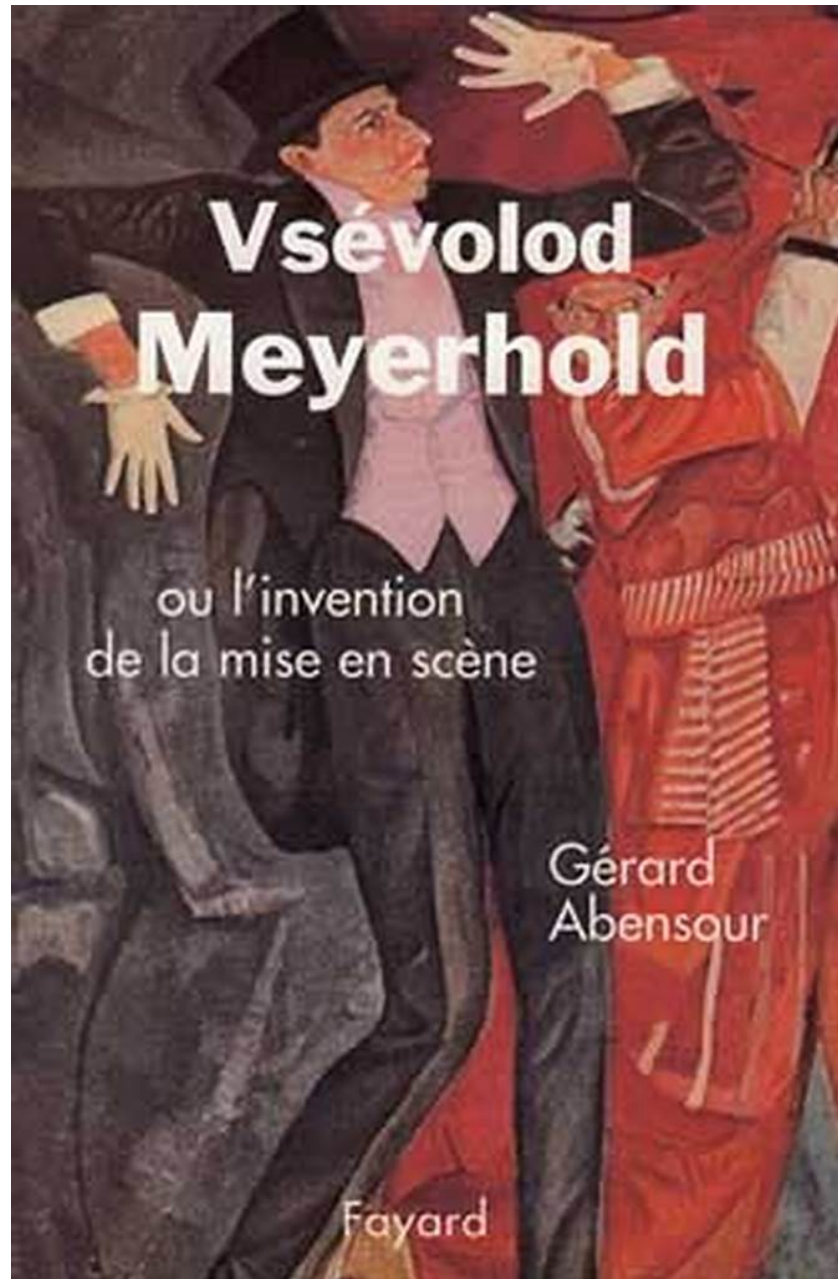
A Pioneer of Modern Theater

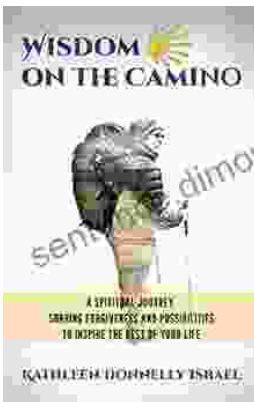
